Colonel Jason Wieman currently serves as the Director of Fort Belvoir Community Hospital. Belvoir Hospital is a 120-bed, 1.3 million-square-foot military community hospital that serves a regional population of 250,000 beneficiaries with over 92,000 enrollees receiving inpatient and specialty care services supported by 55 specialty clinics, a Warrior Pavilion (for combat injured/wounded/ill), Inpatient Addictions Program, and two satellite family health centers at Dumfries and Fairfax, Va.

Prior to assuming his current position, Col. Wieman was Hospital Commander at the Weed Army Community Hospital, Fort Irwin, Calif. As the Hospital Commander, he was responsible for overseeing the medical care and medical readiness of the National Training Center, the Army's premier training facility.
